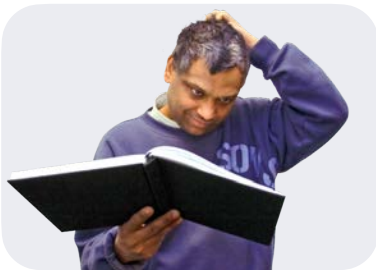




Dr Amy Bonsall
